Date: 02/14/2014

Type of Setting: This lesson will be taught in a self-contained 4th/5th grade classroom. The 4th and 5th graders separate during the math lessons, so only seven students will be present for the lesson.

1. PURPOSE

This lesson will help the students gain a better understanding of place value by comparing and ordering decimals to thousandths.

Essential Questions-

~How can you use place value to compare and order decimals?~

2. VOCABULARY & KEY TERMS

Decimal: The point or dot used to separate the whole number part from the fractional part of a number.

Place Value: the value of where the digit is in the number, such as unit, tens, etc.

Example: In the number 3.544, the place value of 5 is tenths.

3. OBJECTIVE(S)

Students will be able to identify place values.

Students will be able to order decimal numbers by comparing the place values up to the thousandths place.

4. NEW YORK STATE LEARNING STANDARDS:

Understand the place value system C.5. NBT. 3

a. Read and write decimals to thousandths using base-ten numerals, number names, and expanded form, e.g., $347.392 = 3 \times 100 + 4 \times 10 + 7 \times 1 + 3 \times (1/10) + 9 \times (1/100) + 2 \times (1/1000)$.

b. Compare two decimals to thousandths based on meanings of the digits in each place, using $>$, $=$, and $<$ symbols to record the results of comparisons.

5. PRE-ASSESSMENT:

This lesson is being used to help the students develop a better understanding of the significance of place values. They will build on previous concepts and use different strategies along the way.

6. LESSON PRESENTATION:

SET INDUCTION-

Write the essential question on the board, ~How can you use place value to compare and order decimals?~ Call on a student to read the question and discuss that by the completion of this lesson we will be able to it. Then, ask the student ~When do we compare or order
