About the Novel: *The Outsiders* is the classic coming of age story about two social groups in 1960s Oklahoma. The Greasers and the Socs are rival social groups who engage in petty fights around town. Ponyboy and his friends are Greasers and get jumped by the Socs regularly. One night after leaving a local drive-in, Ponyboy and his friend Johnny get jumped from a group of Socs who have a score to settle. Things go too far and one of the Socs gets killed. Ponyboy and Johnny now find themselves running from the police. After a week hiding out, the pair decide to return and face the consequences of their actions. Things go from bad to worse as the story faces its climax with a final rumble between the Greasers and the Socs.

**Quarter Life: Chronicles of Adulthood, Part 1** Matt Sanchez, 2024-11-15 Haze and his friends are new adult bachelors in San Francisco with a social life full of hilarious shenanigans. Despite their antics, his friends develop careers and romantic relationships while Haze struggles to find his place. One day he feels overwhelmed so he ditches work and watches Star Wars movies all day. He gets out of his funk after meeting a champagne-loving athletic farm girl named Alex at the BottleRock music festival in Napa.
