particular may have direct impact but it is also likely that the confidentiality guidelines will undergo revision particularly in view of the increasing importance of genetic data The new legal aspects outlined above will require some changes to the ethical analysis the ethical issues of new technology will be included cloning transgenesis and chimera i e forming organisms from more than one species and stem cells resource allocation ethics is moving on to examining a wider range of issues than covered in the first edition and this will be discussed the whole area of mental disorder and capacity to consent is an active area of ethical research and the second edition would cover some of this new work

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
