Manual Of Zen Buddhism Daisetz Teitaro Suzuki, 2017-03-31 Daisetz Teitaro Suzuki D Litt Professor of Buddhist Philosophy in the Otani University Kyoto was born in 1870 He is probably now the greatest living authority on Buddhist philosophy and is certainly the greatest authority on Zen Buddhism His major works in English on the subject of Buddhism number a dozen or more and of his works in Japanese as yet unknown to the West there are at least eighteen He is moreover as a chronological bibliography of books on Zen in English clearly shows the pioneer teacher of the subject outside Japan for except for Kaiten Nukariya's *Religion of the Samurai* Luzac and Co 1913 nothing was known of Zen as a living experience save to the readers of *The Eastern Buddhist* 1921 1939 until the publication of *Essays in Zen Buddhism Volume I* in 1927 Dr Suzuki writes with authority Not only has he studied original works in Sanskrit Pali Chinese and Japanese but he has an up to date knowledge of Western thought in German and French as well as in the English which he speaks and writes so fluently He is moreover more than a scholar he is a Buddhist
