Frog Life Cycle



After a female frog lays her eggs, it takes weeks for them to grow into adults. Not all eggs turn into frogs. Some eggs die or get eaten. The eggs that survive start out with only one cell inside. That one cell splits into two cells, then four, then eight, until it is a mass of cells called a frog embryo. The embryo grows into a tadpole that hatches from the egg in 6-21 days.

The tadpole lives in water. It uses gills to help it breathe. When it hatches a tadpole doesn't have legs at first. Next, a tadpole grows into a young frog. It still has a small tail. A young frog starts to develop lungs to breathe. Last, the young frog grows into an adult frog. An adult frog doesn't have a tail. The adult female frog lays eggs and the cycle starts all over again.
