Orca are large marine mammals that live in the ocean. These 12,000-pound animals are carnivorous and are known to prey on fish, seals, sea turtles, and sharks. These spotted whales can eat up to 500 pounds of food each day. They live in family groups, or pods, and grow to be 32-35 feet long in 10-15 years of age.

Beluga whales are large sea mammals that live in the ocean. The average weight of a beluga whale is between 2,000-3,000 pounds. They are omnivorous and commonly eat fish, crabs, and crustaceans. Their large foreheads and flexible backs make them easily identifiable among other large sea mammals. They live in pods and grow to be 32-35 feet long. Their lifespan is between 35-50 years.
