1. Luis and Maria are classic examples of transitions that occur during midlife. Based on the case study, what are the areas of transition? Identify the transitions and discuss what this will mean to their self-identities and for the family as a system.

- The biggest transition Luis and Maria are facing is the loss of Ramon and taking care of Carmen. This is happening at a time when Maria is pregnant and the kids are going to be off to college. The cost of college and other expenses such as funeral cost and unforeseen medical expenses have been weighing on the family. This has been especially hard on Rolando, who is being pressured by Luis to take over the family business and continue to provide.

2. Identify the red flags or areas for concern for Luis and Maria. Write a summary discussing possible consequences of the red flags that have been identified.

- Red flags
 - Luis' pressure on Rolando to work for the family business and provide many of grandchildren
 - Luis has begun to feel unusually fatigued and has had some moments of feeling unsteady when he is working in the vineyard. He has had some moments of numbness and blurred vision but attributes them to the long hours
 - Luis tries to plan a funeral for his father but his mother does not want to make decisions. Luis' stress level is high and continues to feel "off balance." Luis is also feeling financial stress.
 - Carmen has stopped helping with the children and is no longer interested in doing family activities or even going to church on Sunday. Maria is feeling the strain of not having help and has no energy. Maria feels that she is starting menopause and these are simply the symptoms
 - Maria is now overwhelmed with a new baby on the way and with a husband who is ill with a progressive disease. Maria does not understand what has happened to her life

3. Identify the tasks, according to Erikson, that need to be completed by Luis and Maria. Do you see any interruption to these tasks?

- Erikson identifies the middle adulthood as being generativity vs. self absorption. I believe that Luis and Maria need to have an equal balance of worrying about the family and the future generation and worrying about themselves. If they get too caught up in self absorption and what they want, it very well could be the demise of their family and lead the children to resent them.

4. Do you see any economic implications for the family in the future? What does this mean for future developmental tasks for Luis and Maria and for their entire family system? Will the economic implications have an effect on the transitions and trajectories of the family members?
