

While reading Transforming Theological Education on a flight, I got talking to my neighbor who taught in a different field – music performance. His passion for teaching and sense of success came from not just helping school band students perform well, but cultivating in them a life-long love for music. Some of the band members he had just taken to perform in a 'Big Band Blast' were students he had taught in school and then recruited to his band. We compared notes on assessment, because for musicians the ultimate assessment is how they sound with other band members when performing. It reminded me that the ultimate test for theological education is how people practice and healthily 'perform' ministry; and not just at graduation but over years to come.



It is helpful to develop the art and craft of orchestrating learning in conversation with teachers from other disciplines and contexts. This is the biggest value of Transforming Theological Education for teachers of theology and religion. Perry Shaw is an Australian whose context is as teacher and acting Academic Dean at Arab Baptist Theological Seminary (ABTS) in Lebanon. Shaw has a contagious passion for empowering students for service in the church and society. He has taught material from this book in faculty training events and in London School of Theology programs for theological educators. But most valuably ABTS has been reshaping its approach to training with new paradigms and instructional techniques in an integrative and holistic curriculum that Shaw unpacks for the reader.

The first part of the book focuses on intentionality in institutional language and culture to serve the church and its work in the Arab world. Foundationally, Shaw counsels using learning outcomes to reshape a syllabus. ABTS has explored how ministerial training for leadership can take seriously contextual challenges, and accordingly revised its vision, mission, profile of an ideal graduate, and educational values, which become a helpful grid to evaluate curriculum redesign. ABTS's core educational values are authentic worship, missional church, Christlike leadership, empowerment, reflective practice, community cohesion, and personal and spiritual development. There are elements that my teaching could learn from ABTS's model, but more importantly I am challenged to consider what are the unique integrative values and elements that ought to infiltrate my teaching and writing? I.e., what lies at the foundation of my curriculum for my teaching?

Shaw puts a range of curriculum issues and methodology choices under the microscope — student cohort composition, faculty evaluation, curriculum fragmentation and the hidden and null curriculum. In exploring multidimensional learning, he urges moving beyond rhetoric of 'head, heart and hands' and to foster cognitive, affective and behavioural development. At ABTS this means cultivating a mind committed to reflective practice, a heart of love for God and others, and hands of servant leadership for empowering people. Shaw emphasises that fostering transformation will not come by adding more content, but focusing on developing thinking and processing skills and making more space for reflection on the most important content. He offers advice for utilising curricular elements outside the classroom — mentoring, field education and community worship. Finally he offers wise counsel for deep learning, including practical suggestions for structuring teaching segments in 20-30 minute blocks, front-ending the most important content, and helping students identify lesson relevance and application.
