À travers la mort Louise Michel, 2021-02-11 L histoire de la publication des M moires de Louise Michel est tonnante elle date en 1886 chez l éditeur Roy sous le titre maintes fois réitéré de M moires de Louise Michel critiqués par elle-même Tome I Aucun autre tome n'a suivi Et si par la suite sont venus à accoler d'autres critiques de la célèbre anarchiste les soixante-dix feuillets qui constituent le véritable second tome parus dans la presse de 1890 avaient disparu peut-être victimes collatérales d'une entreprise de récupération de l'autobiographie de Louise Michel juste après sa mort Aussi l'édition de ce second tome dans une librairie constitue-t-elle un événement Couvrant les années 1886-1890 période qui suit l'œuvre après la mort de Marianne Michel la mère et de Victor Hugo l'idole pour se refermer en août 1890 son départ pour Londres ce gisement incroyablement riche révèle une cravaine viscéralement engagée dans la créature vivant ensemble le rapport à l'histoire la mémoire au présent de sa lutte et la créature L'édition critique de ces M moires accompagnée d'un dossier documentaire est publiée par Claude Rattat directrice de recherche au CNRS

**Louise Michel, à travers la mort** Louise Michel, 2006 **Uncanonical Women** Wendy Greenberg, 2023-12-14 In English here is presented for the first time an examination of the text and context of five nineteenth-century French women poets Elisa Mercoeur 1808-1835 Marceline Desbordes-Valmore 1786-1859 Louisa Siefert 1845-1877 Louise Ackermann 1813-1890 and Louise Michel 1830-1905 will demonstrate that in spite of mentoring by various literary historic or even family figures these writers found their own voices A striking example is Louisa Siefert who in spite of bold intertextuality displays an unmistakably feminine persona whose originality poignantly draws the reader's attention These poets had many obstacles to overcome as women identified poets For example Louise Ackermann's own husband did not want her to write and for this reason she remained silent during her years of marriage Louise Michel is a different case as an analysis of the short poem Bouche close Le Livre du Bagne 1873-1880 will demonstrate In short Uncanonical Women explores a crescendo of poetic voice from the initial timid solicitations of Elisa Mercoeur to the bold self-sufficient defiance of Louise Michel The implication of my original findings that uncanonical poets can surpass cultural marginalization is that the book will target both a traditional and modern readership Major themes and clear language and tools that delineate identifiably personal style of true writers and the poetic persona of each is unique Mercoeur in ambition Desbordes-Valmore in domesticity Siefert in anguish Ackermann in pessimism and Michel in leadership

reste m connue Avec le talent qu on lui connaît Marie Hélène Baylac est partie sur les traces de l anarchiste la plus célèbre de France Nelly Vroncourt la Côte en 1830 d une servante abusée par son chef telain Louise est levée comme une demoiselle et devenue institutrice elle monte Paris l'âge de 26 ans Dès lors sa vie se confond avec laquelle d'une société plus juste Elle fréquente les milieux républicains s investit dans l'éducation populaire et pour l'emancipation des femmes fait ses premières armes de militante socialiste La guerre franco prussienne de 1870 puis la Commune revêt une combattante intrépide Elle y perd l'amour de sa vie Théophile Ferré mais son courage et sa fierté la transforment en icône Dès lors en Nouvelle Calédonie Louise est l'une des premières à intéresser la nature et la culture kanak Elle y puise une source d'inspiration qui parcourra toute son œuvre littéraire son retour Paris en 1880 les foules se pressent pour entendre la Vierge rouge désormais convaincue qu'il n'est de solution la misère et aux injustices que dans l'abolition brutale de l'état Pendant un quart de siècle oratrice infatigable autant qu'érivaine prolifique elle tient la police en haleine multiplie les séjours en prison se réfugie Londres Son chemin croise les grandes crises de la Troisième République du boulangisme l'affaire Dreyfus Elle côtoie les figures majeures de la pensée révolutionnaire internationale Blanqui Kropotkin Malatesta et les ténors de la vie politique Clemenceau les Jules Favre Simon Guesde Ferry etc Quand elle meurt Marseille début 1905 au retour d'une tournée en Algérie la presse s'incline devant la dernière des romantiques reconnaissant qu'elle force le respect de tous y compris de ceux qui combattaient ses idées Puisant aux crits abondants de la grande citoyenne et aux sources officielles témoignages articles de presse visites de terrain la plume enlevée et experte de Marie Hélène Baylac nous entraîne dans le récit de cette vie piquante

**BOOK JACKET    The Roland Legend in Nineteenth Century French Literature** Harry Redman Jr., 2021-12-14 The year was 778 Charlemagne starting homeward after an expedition onto the Iberian Peninsula left his nephew Count Roland in command of a rear guard As Roland and his troops moved through the Pyrenees a fierce enemy swooped down and annihilated them Whether the attackers were Moors Basques Gascons or Aquitainians is still disputed The massacre soon passed into legend preserved but at the same time expanded and interpreted in oral tradition and written accounts Dormant after the late Middle Ages the legend began to inspire literary works even before the discovery and publication of the Oxford manuscript Chanson de Roland in 1837 The French Revolution and Empire temporarily relieving Roland of his religious aura hailed him as a patriot belaboring his country s foes The Romantics made him either a dauntless irrepressible extrovert or a noble victim struck down while making the world a better place As the twentieth century dawned a few authors scoffed at hero worship but others held up Roland as a heroic example that might help his countrymen live with the humiliation of their defeat in the Franco Prussian War and then as World War I approached retake their lost territories Fascinating as the Roland legend is in itself no one has looked into the nonacademic French literature to which it has given rise in modern times Harry Redman now shows how writers with varying outlooks and approaches and divergent purposes drew upon the legend from 1777 to the end of World War I A monumental enterprise based on primary research the book is of extraordinary value to scholars interested in the Old French epic and to all those concerned with more recent literary periods    Mémoires de Louise Michel écrits par elle-même Louise Michel, 1886    **La chanson de la Commune** Robert Brécy, 1991    **Nous ne sommes rien, soyons toutes !** Ludivine Bantigny, 2025-03-07T00:00:00+01:00 Depuis la Révolution les femmes n'ont cessé de lutter pour l'égalité et pour la liberté Elles parlent, crient, manifestent, chantent, résistent et se engagent pour leurs droits à l'égalité et la justice Elles sont ouvertes aux institutions domestiques, esclaves affranchies, journalistes, mais aussi aux artistes.
