Though the Handbook does not and cannot include every area of research, it is meant to provide suggestions for future work on lesser-studied areas, e.g., variation, heterogeneity in regional social and ethnic communities, by highlighting a need for collaborative perspectives and innovative thinking while reasserting the need for better research and communication in areas thought to be resolved.
