 - 1. Author Biography:
 - F. Scott Fitzgerald (1896-1940) was an influential American author known for his iconic novel "The Great Gatsby," published in 1925.
 - II. Born in St. Paul, Minnesota, Fitzgerald's writing captured the essence of the Jazz Age, exploring themes of wealth, love, and the American Dream.
 - III. He attended Princeton University but dropped out before completing his degree to enlist in the Army during World War I
 - IV. Fitzgerald's experiences in the war deeply impacted his worldview and later found reflection in his writing.
 - V. He wrote several other novels, including "This Side of Paradise," "Tender Is the Night," and "The Beautiful and Damned," all of which explored themes of wealth, class, and the pursuit of the American Dream.

- The 1920s was a decade of profound social changes.
- II. The most obvious signs of change were the rise of a consumer-oriented economy and of mass entertainment, which helped to bring about a "revolution in morals and manners."
- III. Sexual mores, gender roles, hair styles, and dress all changed profoundly during the 1920s.
- IV. Many Americans regarded these changes as liberation from the country's Victorian past. But for others, morals seemed to be decaying, and the United States seemed to be changing in undesirable ways.
- V. The result was a thinly veiled "cultural civil war."
