Prime Obsession John Derbyshire, 2003-04-15 In August 1859 Bernhard Riemann a little known 32 year old mathematician presented a paper to the Berlin Academy titled On the Number of Prime Numbers Less Than a Given Quantity In the middle of that paper Riemann made an incidental remark a guess a hypothesis What he tossed out to the assembled mathematicians that day has proven to be almost cruelly compelling to countless scholars in the ensuing years Today after 150 years of careful research and exhaustive study the question remains Is the hypothesis true or false Riemann's basic inquiry the primary topic of his paper concerned a straightforward but nevertheless important matter of arithmetic defining a precise formula to track and identify the occurrence of prime numbers But it is that incidental remark the Riemann Hypothesis that is the truly astonishing legacy of his 1859 paper Because Riemann was able to see beyond the pattern of the primes to discern traces of something mysterious and mathematically elegant shrouded in the shadows subtle variations in the distribution of those prime numbers Brilliant for its clarity astounding for its potential consequences the Hypothesis took
