The self psychology of Heinz Kohut has been an important force in contemporary psychoanalytic thought and its ramifications for therapy have been extensively explored. Now Marshall Silverstein offers the first analysis of the application of self psychology to projective diagnostic assessment. Differentiating the self psychological approach from an ego psychological interpretation of classical drive theory, he clearly outlines the principal contributions of Kohut including the concepts of selfobject functions, empathy, transmuting internalization, and compensatory structure. Providing numerous clinical examples, he shows how the major selfobject functions of mirroring, idealization, and twinship can be identified on projective tests. Silverstein then demonstrates how conventional assessment approaches to grandiosity, self esteem, and idealization can be reconceptualized within the framework of self psychology, and he also contrasts ego psychological interpretations with self psychological interpretations. This book makes a strong case for the importance of the clinical identification of self states. It will help practitioners understand their patients' varied attempts to repair an injury to the self, to restore self esteem, compensatory structure, and the clinical consequences of self disorders including disintegration products such as narcissistic rage and affect states characterized by empty depression, chronic boredom, and lack of zest.

Neuropsychological Interpretation of Objective Psychological Tests Charles J. Golden, Patricia Espe-Pfeifer, Jana Wachslar-Felder, 2006-04-11. The inter comparison of specific skills as represented by performance on neuropsychological tests is at the heart of the neuropsychological assessment process. However, there is a tendency to regard the interpretation of single tests as a process that is independent of performance on other tests, with integration of test information representing a summary of these individual test performances. As neuropsychology has become increasingly sophisticated, it has been recognized that many factors influence the performance on any given test. The meaning of the same score may vary considerably from one person to another depending on his or her performance on other neuropsychological tests. Thus a low score on the Halstead Category Test may indeed reflect frontal lobe damage, but only if we first rule out the influence of visual spatial problems, emotionality, attentional issues, motivation, fatigue, and comprehension of the instructions. Simplistic interpretations that assume a common interpretation based on a specific score will inevitably lead to errors in interpretation and conclusions. The purpose of this book is to provide each test that is described with a compendium of the possible interpretations that can be used with a variety of common tests that are often included in a neuropsychological test battery.
