Summary means a short description that gives the main and important information about something, without giving all the details.

How to summarizing a story:

- Write about the setting (place and time), the main characters, the problem and the solution of the story.
- Write only important events without details.
- 3. Put the events in the same order in which they appear in the story.
- 4. Don't repeat information, even if it's repeated in the story.
- 5. You can use your words but use vocabulary from the story when you can.
- Use category words instead of lists of words (e.g. vegetables instead of carrots, tomatoes and potatoes).

You can highlight or underline the important events to make it easy.
