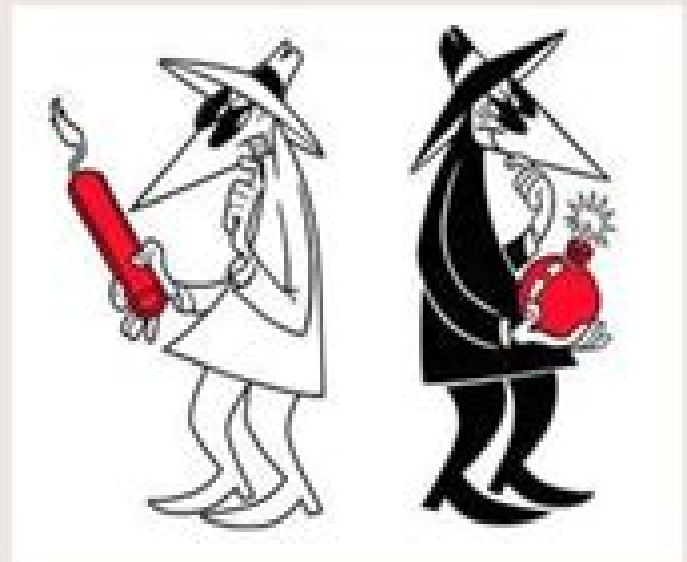


# *Protagonist and Antagonist*
