anxiety and depression The study concluded that single parenting is caused by divorce death separation and not married Also the study confirms that single parenting hinders students academic performance in secondary schools The study recommended that single parents should buy all school requirements for their children and spend time for academic issues related to their children The study also recommends that head teachers should pay more attention to single parenting students and provide counseling to them to encourage them Also the government should identify the needs of single parenting students and act accordingly
