Foundational to her program are reading and writing. When she differentiated curriculum to support all students' needs, she found their learning accelerated. All teachers will appreciate her ideas about how to teach the basics of math as well as advanced math concepts. And her ideas for teaching the arts are inspirational as she describes in detail how her fourth graders performed Shakespeare's *Hamlet*, *Macbeth*, *King Lear*, *Julius Caesar*, and *A Midsummer Night's Dream*.
