The Case Review SBAR template is used to assist staff with the review of the referred case and includes identifying an situation in the nursing process, adequacy of documentation, contributing factors, determination if the situation caused patient harm, and recommendations for either APAC review or manager follow-up based on the findings from the case review. The initial case review template and findings are recommended to be completed and distributed to the appropriate team one week prior to the regularly scheduled meeting so APAC members arrive to the meetings with baseline knowledge of the case in efforts to maximize meetings under two hours.
