Contributions are divided into three groups which i) examine various features and aspects of public and institutional discourse about the COVID 19 pandemic ii) scrutinize the way health policies have been discussed, debated, attacked and defended in the public sphere and iii) consider a range of proposals meant to improve the quality of public discourse and public deliberation in particular in such a way that concrete proposals for argumentative literacy will be brought to light. Overall, this volume constitutes a timely inquiry into all things argumentative in pandemic discourse. This volume is of interest to a broad readership including philosophers, linguists, communication and legal scholars and members of the wider public who seek to better understand the discourse surrounding communicative phenomena in times of crisis.
