1 red onion
2 red peppers
120 g bacon

olive oil

oregano
50 g pasta per person

- Heat some olive oil in a pan and fry the onion, red peppers and bacon.
- Add oregano, garlic, tomatoes and water and cook for 20 minutes.
- Cook the pasta in a big pot of boiling water.
