

FINE MOTOR SKILLS

Fine motor skills refer to the skills we have in making small movements and adjustments using the small muscles in our hands, wrists, fingers, face, feet, and toes.

FINE VS GROSS MOTOR SKILLS

- Fine motor skills involve the coordination of small muscle groups, primarily in the hands and fingers, to achieve fine manipulation tasks.
- Gross motor skills are exercised when we engage large muscle groups to perform big movements, often in bursting motions like running, jumping and throwing.

FINE MOTOR SKILLS EXAMPLES

- Dressing formally: You adapt your clothing choices to suit professional norms.
- Laughing because everyone else is laughing: Even if you don't understand the joke, you laugh along to feel part of the group.
- Buying sneakers: You choose the sneaker brand because it is popular among your peers.
