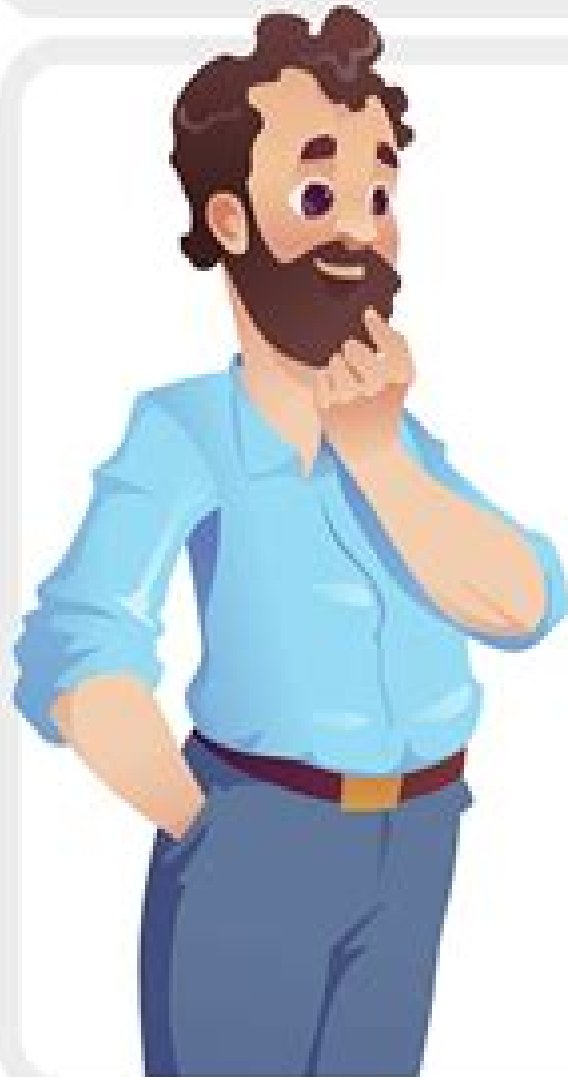


A THESIS STATEMENT
